EVENT OVERVIEW

In this landmark year for the ocean, the world will gather to advance ocean action on multiple fronts. In addition to the UN Ocean Conference, a major milestone will be the 15th meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD COP 15), scheduled to take place from 5 to 17 December 2022, in Montreal, Canada, during which governments are expected to adopt a new post-2020 global biodiversity framework. framework will contain a new set of global goals and targets for biodiversity with a focus on reversing global trends in biodiversity loss and ensuring that ecosystems can continue to provide critical life supporting services.

The post-2020 framework will be a major catalyst for enhanced ocean action and will provide a critical means to "carry the torch" on from SDG 14.

This side event will explore the critical interlinkages between SDG 14 and the post-2020 framework, the importance of an ambitious post-2020 framework that will embed enhanced commitments for the ocean and the need for the post-2020 framework to continue the legacy of SDG 14.
