THE FORM AMENDING ANNEX 1 OF THE RAPTORS MOU

(Prepared by the Coordinating Unit of the Raptors MOU)

Summary: In order to provide the necessary information supporting the proposal of amending the list of species in Annex I of the MOU, the Technical Advisory Group has developed a specific form.

The Meeting is invited to adopt the form.

- 1. Annex 1 of the Raptors MOU lists migratory birds of prey in Africa and Eurasia.
- The Technical Advisory Group (TAG) roles as described in its <u>Terms of Reference</u> include in article 4c to '[p]rovide comments on any proposal to amend the MOU text, which have a technical content' and Rule 16.3a the Rules of Procedure (<u>UNEP/CMS/Raptors/MOS2/Report/Annex I</u>) assign to TAG the role of commenting on amendment proposals to the MOU.
- In order to be in the best position to comment on proposals for amendments to Annex 1 (Species List), The Third meeting of the TAG (Sempach, 2018) asked the Coordinating Unit to develop a draft guidance/standard form that could be used by Signatories to propose amendments to the Species List of the Raptors MOU.
- 4. The Fourth meeting of the TAG endorsed the form presented in Annex 1 of the current document.

5. The Meeting is requested to adopt the amendment of the mentioned form as presented in Annex 1 to this document.

4. If this entity has been proposed for addition to Annex 1 previously and not accepted,

or lower taxon of wild animals, a significant proportion of whose members cyclically and predictably cross one or more national jurisdictional boundaries".

Please note that where ringing, resighting or tracking data are provided as evidence, this should relate to wild hatched individuals. Such information from captive-bred / reared and released individuals will not be considered eligible. Information from wild-hatched individuals which have spent a short period in captivity for rehabilitation will be considered on a case by case basis.

In October 1988, at the 2nd Conference of Parties to CMS, Resolution 2.2 was adopted and provides further clarification, as follows:

^{1.} Adopts the following guidelines for the application of certain terms of the Convention interpreted in Article 1, paragraph 1:

⁽a) In the interpretation of the term "migratory species" in Article 1, paragraph 1 (a):

⁽i) The word "cyclically" in the phrase "cyclically and predictably" relates to a cycle of any nature, such as astronomical (circadian, annual etc.), life or climatic, and of any frequency;

⁽ii) The word "predictably" in the phrase "cyclically and predictably" implies that a phenomenon can be anticipated to recur in a given set of circumstances, though not necessarily regularly in time.
