## **RECOMMENDATIONS TO COP14**

Not recommended for adoption.

## **GENERAL COMMENTS ON THE DOCUMENT**

- The Scientific Council did not recommend adoption and suggested including the activities in draft Decisions.
- The Scientific Council further recommended developing a new proposal for Concerted Action for submission to COP15, which includes activities to fill important knowledge gaps.
- The Scientific Council agreed that, given the legal nature of the proposed activities, these would be more appropriately reflected in draft Decisions and should be implemented in the context of the CMS Legislation Programme. The proponent was encouraged to prepare draft Decisions to this effect for COP14.
- The Scientific Council recommended the following wording for the draft Decisions for consideration by the proponent:

Directed to Parties

14.AA Parties are requested to provide to the CMS Secretariat information on their domestic and regional management measures for the oceanic whitetip shark by [date], clarifying how they meet the objectives of the CMS Appendix I listing.

Directed to the Secretariat

- 14.BB The Secretariat is requested to
  - a) issue a notification by [date] to seek information from Parties in fulfilment of Decision 14.AA;
  - b) collate the information provided by Parties in response to Decision 14. AA, and transmit this information to the Standing Committee for review in advance of its [xxth] meeting.

Directed to the Standing Committee

- 14.CC The Standing Committee is requested to review the compilation of information provided by the Secretariat in fulfilment of Decision 14.BB, and to report progress and make recommendations for further action to the Conference of the Parties at its 15th meeting.
- It was further noted that reporting on the implementation of obligations related to Appendix I listings should be part of National Reports.
- It was recommended that research activities to fill important knowledge gaps should be included in a new Concerted Action proposal for submission to COP15. Such gaps would include, inter alia, information on genetics, movement patterns and critical habitat.
- It was noted with concern that the once highly abundant species is now Critically Endangered and that, despite actions made by Regional Fisheries Management Organizations to adopt strict management measures, the species is still subject to illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing and trade.
