

Responding to the impacts of COVID-19 2020 United Nations – Nippon Foundation Alumni Network Virtual Training Series

In light of the far-reaching impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on people, societies, and efforts to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, DOALOS is refocusing its capacity-building activities.

In particular, under the auspices of the United Nations - Nippon Foundation Programme Alumni Network, DOALOS is developing a series of seminars and training sessions to be delivered in an adapted virtual format and which aim at providing opportunities for continued learning, discussions, and engagement in key ocean-related spheres, including to identify and address the new and additional challenges stemming from the impacts of COVID-19 for the sustainable



The UNNF Virtual Training Series encompasses three training streams: (1) Seminars on current and specialized ocean-related themes; (2) Training programme on the law of the sea; and (3) Professional skills development. The series, details of which may be found on the programme below, is open to Fellows and Alumni of the UNNF Programmes, as well as HSA Fellows and invited guests. Eligible individuals may also opt to participate in related programmes leading to the award of a training certificate, upon completion of the necessary requirements.
