NMEA Statement to the United Nations at the Prep Meeting for the 2020 UN Ocean Conference to Support the Implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 14

Thank you, Co-facilitators, Excellencies, ladies and gentlemen,

The National Marine Educators Association, NMEA, is honored to be a part of this Preparatory Meeting for the 2020 Ocean Conference to help support the effective implementation of SDG 14.

Founded in the United States in 1976, NMEA is a member-based organization of classroom teachers, informal educators, professors, scientists, government agencies and other stakeholders from around the world working together to advance the understanding of our freshwater and marine ecosystems.
